FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

The Olympic coverage the other day spoke of a speed skater, Sven Kramer, from the Netherlands. He was favored to win a gold medal in the seemingly endless 10,000 meter race. He finished in the best time: in fact Olympic record time. But he finished in the wrong lane and was disqualified. With eight laps left he, along with his coach, got mixed up and took the wrong lane.

Sometimes we can get confused and go in the wrong lane; take the wrong path; follow the wrong advice. No matter how hard we try, or, how fervent our convictions or efforts, we can end up in the wrong place— even in record time.

The Church and the season of Lent assist us in staying on the right path. One of the Lenten Prefaces to the Eucharistic Prayer reminds us: “This great season of grace is Your gift to Your family to renew us in spirit.” The question is how do we use the opportunity? Here at Incarnation there are opportunities each day that allow us to get our bearings to keep us on the right path. Daily Mass, Lenten Vespers on Wednesday nights, Stations of the Cross on Friday nights in addition to weekly gatherings of prayer groups. Food and clothing drives inspire us to assist the needy. And we have the opportunity to fast this Lent, especially from sin, as the Sacrament of Penance is offered weekly.

The Church Community is in this great race to the Promised Land together. But do we see ourselves intertwined in the great endeavor or are we just going it alone? The more we go it alone, the more opportunities there are to get in the wrong lane. And not just us. What about others? What is my responsibility to help others stay on the right path? “Am I my brother’s keeper?” is a commonly heard sentiment. No, you are not your brother’s keeper but could you at least give him some directions? Or better yet lead him in the right lane.

Plans are being made for our parish Feast Celebrations on March 25th and 27th. By celebrating the entire Parish Community we strive to make progress together on our Journey to the Promised Land. We need each other. And with the proper vision we can see in those around us the Presence of the Word Incarnate.

I hope that you will seize the opportunities offered here at Incarnation this Lent and that you will join in our parish festivities in March. Drawing strength and guidance from the Lord and each other we can finish the race together.

I’m pretty sure if Sven Kramer was racing in a team relay, his teammates would never have allowed him to finish first - but in the wrong lane. God Bless!

LENTEN REGULATIONS—Abstinence: The Church Requires all the faithful who have reached their 14th year of age to abstain totally from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent excluding this year March 19: the Solemnity of St. Joseph. **Fasting:** All the faithful between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are also bound to observe the fasting regulation on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This involves limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may be taken at 2 other occasions in the day.
